He has led and supported a wide range of service lines, including women's and children's health, orthopedics, primary care, gastroenterology, and hepatology.

He played a pivotal role in establishing a joint venture with Cincinnati Children's Fetal Care Center and led multiple acquisitions that expanded the system's reach and capabilities. One of his most impactful initiatives is the "School to Work" apprenticeship program, developed in partnership with Cincinnati Public Schools. This program provides over 50 paid positions annually to high school juniors and seniors, with a long-term goal of creating more than 1,000 career opportunities for a diverse group of students. The initiative offers meaningful pathways into healthcare careers and has secured an endowment of over \$14 million through the collaboration of TriHealth, Bethesda Inc., and CommonSpirit.

Jeremiah holds a bachelor's degree in Healthcare Administration from the State University of New York at Brockport and a master's degree in Healthcare Administration from Roberts Wesleyan College. He is board certified in healthcare management through the American College of Healthcare Executives and has completed a Business Certificate Program at Harvard University.
