


## Good Samaritan College of Nursing & Health Science

## **Invested in Student Success**

Private scholarships from donors help to relieve the financial burden that college creates in the lives of students. On average, our RN students pay \$45,500 in tuition, while a BSN student pays nearly \$50,000. Many of our students are parents and are responsible for providing for their families. Approximately 38% of students receive Pell Grants, and 80% of students receive Federal Student Loans.

Because of our donor-supported scholarships, our students can work fewer hours to focus more on their studies, and are able to graduate without the anxiety of the debt that comes with student loans.

This academic year, our family of donors is providing a record \$368,050 in scholarship support through 108 scholarships.




## A History of Excellence
