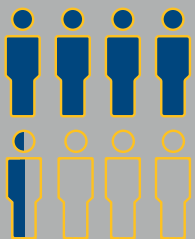


CASE FOR SUPPORT

The average student at GSC is 28 years old.

The financial struggle of college paired with the impending nursing shortage means the future of nursing and health care depend on generous donors that are willing to invest in the training and education of future clinicians.

Thanks to our donors, GSC can provide both academic and financial resources to ensure that each and every student has the opportunity to thrive.

GSC graduates are renowned within the community. Our highly skilled and highly compassionate health care professionals are unique because their training occurs within the hospital and features a heavy emphasis on hands-on experience.

Private scholarships from donors help to relieve the financial burden that college creates in the lives of students. On average, our RN students pay \$45,500 in tuition, while a BSN student pays nearly \$50,000. Many of our students are parents and are responsible for providing for their families.
