As a family we have grown together. In our first fiscal year of operation in 1986, we received 386 gifts and raised \$104,263 for Good Samaritan Hospital. Now, 30 years later we received 6,600 gifts for a total of \$2,551,130 dollars raised for Good Samaritan Hospital, Good Samaritan College of Nursing and Health Science, and the Good Samaritan Free Health Center in Fiscal Year 2016.

SUE O'BRIEN

LEGACY OF A GOOD SAMARITAN

“If there is anything I would like others to learn from Sue and her memory, it would be this: to walk in her shoes, to do what she did, to continue to invest in patient care as a top priority, and to treat people like family, says Tom O'Brien when speaking of his sister Sue.”

Sue O'Brien was the Senior Manager of Finance, Operations for TriHealth's hospitals until her passing in 2014 from melanoma. She was known for her budgeting expertise, but even more so for her humble demeanor yet strong patient advocacy. Because of her compassionate spirit and her personal experience with chronic illnesses throughout her life, putting patients first was always the focus of Sue's work. Understanding the direct impact of budgeting and resource allocation, Sue “took her job very seriously and made sure the hospital was doing the right things for patients,” Tom remarks.

When describing Sue's love of her work at Good Sam, Tom notes, “In addition to us, her work family was also her family.” Paula Niederbaumer, Vice President and Chief Nursing Officer at Good Samaritan, remembers her friend with great admiration and a smile. “She was a very special person with a dedication to serving,” Paula remarks. “She wanted the best for our patients and the organization, and she carried that out by helping Nursing understand their finances and how that impacted people. She was a very good mentor and always wanted to take care of other people.”

In addition to her fierce dedication to her work, family was always important to Sue. Tom is one of Sue's six siblings, and he remembers their childhood fondly. “She was like a second mom to all of us younger kids. She helped us with our homework and would make us homemade pizza for movie nights,” he recalls. With a deep breath and knowing smile, Tom notes, “Sue was the epitome of a big sister.”

That is why Tom was more than willing to help when Sue wanted to discuss estate plans. Tom points out that Sue always lived simply and humbly, and knew that her health would not allow her to reach retirement. Paula also emphasizes this characteristic of Sue when she says, “She was very humble, very giving. She demonstrated great dignity and grace in the face of adversity. She wanted to serve others, and that's what she did.” Sue's simple lifestyle bestowed great generosity upon her 18 nieces and nephews whom she adored, as well as charitable causes.

Of those causes, Good Sam was closest to her heart. “It was fitting that the last donation we made was to the hospital,” says Tom. “The irony of her whole life is that she worked at Good Sam. The Bible verse about the Good Samaritan is how my sister lived her life. I think it's appropriate that Good Sam is where Sue had her most impact.” Sue's impact lives on through the work that she did as well as her estate gift that is supporting the renovation of the Radiation Oncology Department at Good Sam.

This renovation will complete the final phase of the TriHealth Cancer Institute's (TCI) Good Samaritan Hospital Campus. Its purpose is to center all services around the patient and improve patient care. Tom can think of no better way to honor Sue's life and her legacy. “The story of the Good Samaritan should be part of her legacy. The idea of family and kindness and putting the patient first. . . that would be the best way to remember her.” Now, at TCI's Good Samaritan Hospital campus where patient-centered cancer care is the priority, these values will always be part of Sue's legacy.

GOOD SAMARITAN HOSPITAL FOUNDATION THIRTY YEAR RETROSPECTIVE HISTORY



Like Good Samaritan Hospital itself, the history of Good Samaritan Hospital Foundation is rooted in the history of the Sisters of Charity dating back to 1852. Philanthropy has always been part of Good Samaritan: from the Sisters providing free care to wounded Civil War soldiers, to the donation of the original Good Samaritan Hospital to the Sisters of Charity by humbled businessmen in 1866, to the generosity of donors in the 1980s to now. Every step of the way, the hospital's philanthropy has had a single purpose: to live out the parable of the Good Samaritan and provide compassionate care to every person.

In the early 1980s, Good Samaritan Hospital launched its first ever capital campaign. By 1985, the hospital had raised the funds to build the Dixmyth Tower to accommodate more patients. Following this success, a group of dedicated supporters of Good Samaritan announced plans to form the Good Samaritan Hospital Foundation in order to organize and govern the philanthropic efforts of the hospital moving forward. There was much work done to gather a Board of Trustees, write Articles of Incorporation, and perform the necessary filings to set up the organization. On December 26, 1986, Good Samaritan Hospital Foundation of Cincinnati, Inc., officially came into existence.

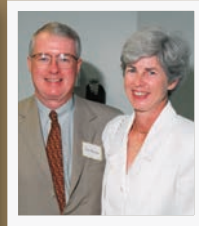


One of the most impactful accomplishments of the first years of the Foundation was the establishment of the endowment for the hospital's greatest needs. Throughout the remainder of the 1980s the Foundation continued to grow and work with many generous volunteers. In 1987, the hospital's "friend-fundraising" volunteer group, The Good Samaritans, became affiliated with the Foundation. Their annual Gala has raised a more than a cumulative \$7.3 million for Good Samaritan over the years.



GOOD SAMARITAN HOSPITAL FOUNDATION THIRTY YEAR RETROSPECTIVE HISTORY

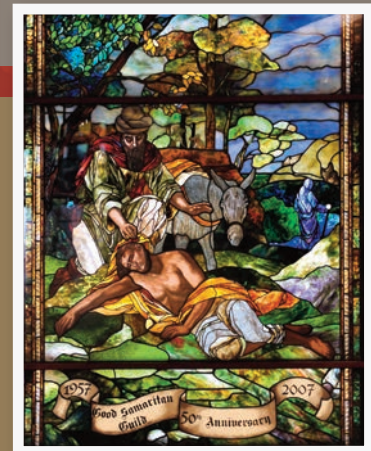
Throughout the 1990s the Foundation expanded fundraising efforts to include annual campaigns, a planned giving program, and project-specific campaigns. Fundraising revenue also grew alongside these efforts, and the Foundation achieved over \$1 million in annual fundraising for the first time in 1995. Soon following were successful campaigns that raised \$2 million to renovate the Emergency Department and \$5.2 million to renovate and upgrade the Neonatal Intensive Care Unit. In 1999, the Good Samaritan Hospital Guild, a volunteer group first established in 1957 to support the hospital, became affiliated with the Foundation to coordinate efforts. The Guild Gift Shop and other fundraisers have provided over \$4.1 million of support to various hospital departments and programs.



In the 2000s, efforts enabled the Foundation's fundraising total to average \$2.5 million annually. The Compassionate Care Multiplied Campaign raised more than \$9.5 million for various areas in the hospital as well as Good Samaritan College of Nursing and Health Science. In the Foundation's most recent decade, donors supported establishing the Robotics Program as a world-renowned program through the renovation of the Minimally Invasive Training Center and the purchase of surgical robots, including several da Vinci® Surgical Systems as well as the Magellan™ Robotic System. In 2011, Foundation donors also enabled the founding and expanding of the Good Samaritan Free Health Center to care for uninsured, disadvantaged individuals in the community. In 2014, donors supported the opening of the new Outpatient Cancer Care Infusion Center.



The impact of every person affiliated with Good Samaritan Hospital Foundation over the years cannot be overstated. Because of the vision of the founders, commitment of volunteers, and generosity of donors, the Foundation has achieved what was espoused in the Articles of Incorporation: to "engage in charitable, educational, and scientific activities for the improvement of health care and the alleviation of sickness, disease, and suffering." The Foundation looks forward to the future and continuing to act as a Good Samaritan to all.

1986 - Certificate of Incorporation

Good Samaritan Hospital Foundation is incorporated December 26, 1986.



1988 - Hospital Endowment

Good Samaritan Hospital Foundation establishes an endowment for the future needs of Good Samaritan Hospital.



1990 - Employee Emergency Fund

With seed money from the Sisters of Charity of Cincinnati, the Foundation establishes the Employee Emergency Fund to assist GSH employees during times of crisis.

1987 - The Good Samaritans

The Good Samaritans become an affiliated volunteer group of the Foundation.



1990 - School of Nursing

Donors provide funds for the first scholarships to be given to students at the Good Samaritan School of Nursing as it was then known.

The Foundation established the Legacy Society to help ensure the long term support of Good Samaritan Hospital.

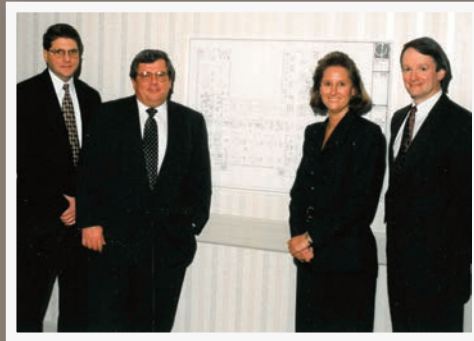
1998 - Neonatal Intensive Care Unit

The Foundation Board of Trustees and staff successfully complete a \$5.2 million fundraising campaign to renovate and upgrade the Neonatal Intensive Care Unit (NICU) to be able to provide the highest level of newborn care in the region.



1996 - Emergency Department

\$2 million is raised through the Emergency Department Campaign to support the renovation of the facility that improved the quality of emergency care for patients.



1999 - Outpatient Cancer Care Unit

Fundraising is completed for the creation of the Outpatient Cancer Care Unit.

1997 - Hatton Institute Endowment

Upon his passing in 1997, Dr. E. Kenneth Hatton's \$1 million legacy gift endowed the Hatton Research Institute, providing financial stability. The Hatton Institute continues to earn recognition as a leader in medical research, education, and innovation.



1999 - Guild

The Good Samaritan Hospital Guild becomes an affiliated volunteer group of the Foundation.



1998 - Employee Campaign

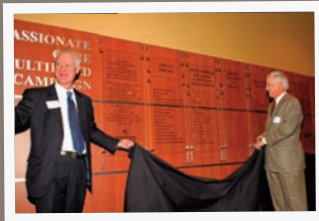
Through conducting the Foundation's first ever Employee Campaign, GSH employees donate funds to create the Employee Fitness Center.

2001-Breast Center

Funds are raised to purchase an R2 Image Checker for the GSH Breast Center. This was the most advanced equipment at the time and GSH was the first in the region to have it.



2011-Chapel

Donors enable the renovation of the Chapel of the Sacred Heart at GSH.

2006-Compassionate Care Multiplied Campaign

The Foundation completes its Compassionate Care Multiplied Campaign exceeding the \$7.5 million goal by raising more than \$9.5 million for the following areas: Cardiac Services, Good Samaritan College of Nursing and Health Science, Medical Education and Research, and Parish Nurse Ministry.



2011-Free Health Center

The Foundation secures funds to establish the Good Samaritan Free Health Center in Price Hill to provide care to disadvantaged, uninsured adults in Hamilton County.



2013-Free Health Center

A generous donor provides funds for the purchase of a facility for the expanding services of the Good Samaritan Free Health Center.

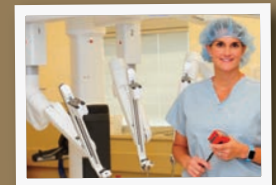
2003-First da Vinci

Because of three very generous donors, \$1.2 million was raised for GSH to acquire the first da Vinci Surgical System in Greater Cincinnati and perform the area's first robotic-assisted surgery. Good Sam has been a pioneer in the field ever since.



2014-Outpatient Cancer Care Infusion Center

The Good Samaritan Cancer Care Center project is completed thanks to the Foundation raising a total of \$1.3 million toward the new Center.



2015-da Vinci Xi

The Foundation raises over \$1 million to purchase the da Vinci Xi Surgical System and the Magellan Robotic System which allows Good Samaritan to continue to be a worldwide leader in minimally invasive surgery.

2008-Medical Education Center

Donors contribute more than \$3 million to complete the Medical Education Center to house the Medical Education Program in a state-of-the-art facility.

2012-Minimally Invasive Training Center

A total of more than \$2.3 million is raised to renovate and expand GSH's Minimally Invasive Training Center. It is one of only 22 robotic training centers in the world.

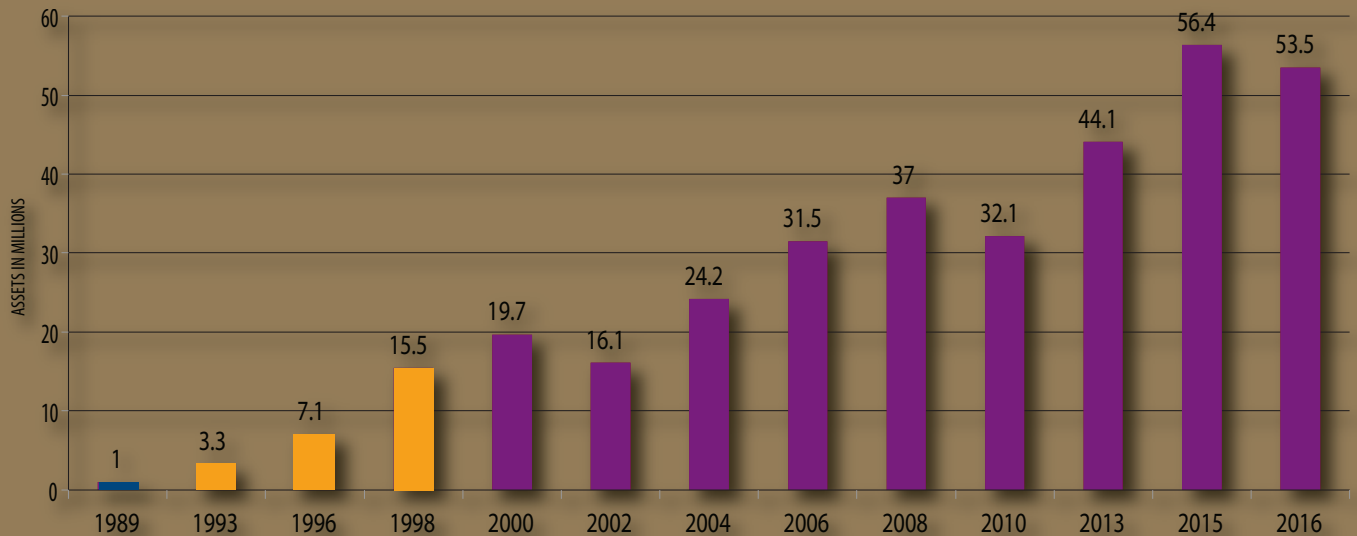

RECENT GRANTS SECURED BY GOOD SAMARITAN HOSPITAL FOUNDATION

Good Samaritan Hospital Foundation is grateful to these organizations for their support and is proud to be their partner in improving the health status of the people we serve.



MARCH OF DIMES, OHIO CHAPTER

March of Dimes, Ohio Chapter awarded \$25,000 for one year to implement CenteringPregnancy® in Good Samaritan Hospital's Faculty Medical Center which serves Medicaid, underinsured, and uninsured patients. CenteringPregnancy® is an evidence-based group prenatal care model that is expected to improve the health outcomes for this population of women and infants who are at disproportionate risk for preterm birth and infant mortality.



SC MINISTRY FOUNDATION

The Good Samaritan Free Health Center will be expanding the Behavioral Health Integration Program thanks to a generous grant from SC Ministry Foundation, which promotes the mission and ministry of the Sisters of Charity. Uninsured, disadvantaged patients face higher rates of behavioral health challenges which affect their physical health. This two year grant will expand a model of care that integrates behavioral health into the Free Health Center's primary care setting to improve patients' overall health and well-being.



THE GREATER CINCINNATI FOUNDATION

Also supporting the Expansion of Behavioral Health Integration project at the Good Samaritan Free Health Center is a \$65,836 grant over two years from The Greater Cincinnati Foundation. Along with GCF's Health and Wellness Fund and its 2016 Community Investment Fund, this grant is also supported by the S. Charles and Sue B. Straus Fund, the Frances Ehrlich Wolf Fund in Memory of Alfred Max Stern, the Delaney Family Fund, and an Anonymous Donor Advised Fund at GCF. The grant will support additional behavioral health staff to provide evidence-based, social work therapy practices to patients. This grant recognizes the pivotal role of behavioral health care in addressing the entirety of a patient's health needs, especially those who are uninsured.



CATHOLIC HEALTH INITIATIVES MISSION AND MINISTRY FUND

Catholic Health Initiatives Mission and Ministry Fund awarded a one year, \$84,640 Project Development Grant to Women's Services at Good Samaritan Hospital. This grant will support work to further define and create an implementation plan for the Partners In Health Program which will identify and address social determinants of health and thus improve outcomes for the vulnerable population of pregnant women and their babies in Good Samaritan Hospital's Faculty Medical Center.



HELEN C. COARD FOUNDATION, PNC BANK, TRUSTEE

\$15,000 was awarded for the Helen Coard Scholarships at the Good Samaritan College of Nursing and Health Science. These scholarships were made possible by longtime Good Samaritan Hospital volunteer Helen Coard. The purpose of the Helen Coard Scholarships is to recruit the best and the brightest students to GSC and to reduce student attrition for students who cannot afford the tuition costs.



FIFTH THIRD FOUNDATION

The Medical Care for the Uninsured Project at the Good Samaritan Free Health Center was financially assisted by the Fifth Third Foundation. This \$5,000 grant award will provide direct medical care to vulnerable, uninsured patients at the Free Health Center who would otherwise have nowhere to turn for routine health care.

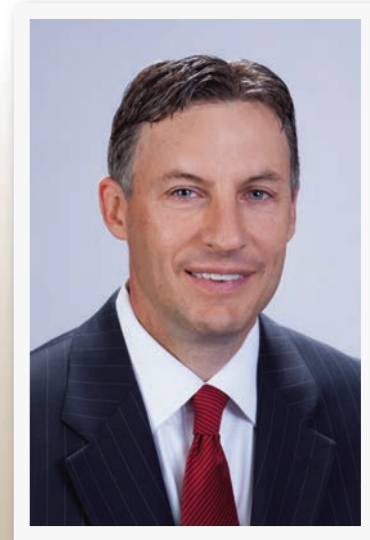
NEWLY NAMED GOOD SAMARITAN REGION GETS LEADER
