Winter Weather Safety Tips for the Family

Heading Out:

- ✓ Dress in layers (children should wear one more layer than adults). Wear a hat, gloves, scarf and waterproof boots. Use sunscreen on exposed skin because of sun reflection on snow.
- ✓ For safety, always remove your child's thick/bulky winter coat before buckling in a car seat.
- ✓ When possible, stay off the roads. If you must, drive slowly and keep a safe distance from other cars.
- ✓ Make sure your car has an emergency kit. Keep the gas tank at least half full and regularly check the battery and tire pressure.

Staying In:

- ✓ Test smoke and carbon monoxide detectors and don't use gas stoves or ovens for heat.
- ✓ Keep space heaters at least 3 feet away from anything flammable and never leave children alone around them.
- ✓ Never leave a child unattended with a space heater going.
- ✓ Avoid overexertion this includes shoveling heavy snow or walking in deep snow. Sweating can lead to chills and hypothermia.

Transitioning to Adult Primary Care

As parents, you have spent years working with your pediatrician to keep your child healthy. Starting around age 13, we encourage children to take more responsibility for their healthcare. This includes understanding their medical history, medications, allergies, immunization records, and their primary care provider's contact information.

By age 18, they will be responsible for their own medical information, preparing them for the transition to adult care. This transition can feel daunting, but it is essential as they move from pediatric care—focused on children's health—to adult care, which often has more complex needs.

Some pediatric providers will see patients until they turn 22; however, most encourage transition to an adult provider sooner. We are here to assist whenever your child (and you) are ready.

HPV Vaccines - Cancer & Infection Prevention

Each year in the US, around 8,000 people die and over 35,000 are diagnosed with a human papilloma (HPV) related cancer. HPV vaccines have been proven to prevent infection, pre-cancers and cancers caused by the virus.

Studies show that administering 2 doses to adolescents (at least 6 months apart) is as effective as 3 doses given to older teens and young adults. Younger individuals produce more antibodies per vaccine dose. HPV vaccination during adolescence also protects against over 90% of the cancers caused by the virus.

This is why TriHealth pediatrics recommends that patients complete the vaccination series by the age of 13.
