## Post-Implant Instructions

# Discharge Instructions for ICDs

### Call your doctor if:

- 1. You become dizzy, faint or black out.
- 2. If you have a fever over 100 degrees.
- 3. If the incision drains for more than two days.
- 4. If you have pain not relieved by medication.
- 5. The area around the ICD becomes red or hot to the touch.
- 6. You receive a shock from the defibrillator before your first follow-up.

#### Wound care:

- 1. Avoid getting the wound wet or dirty for one week
- 2. Remove the occlusive dressing in 48 hours, or as instructed.
- 3. If you have tapes covering the incision (steristrips) remove them after one week.

#### Medication:

- 1. Refer to the medication instruction sheet provided by the nurse.
- 2. Check with your doctor about when to resume any medications you stopped for the procedure.

## Activity:

- 1. Do not drive for 24 hours.
- 2. Avoid strenuous activity using the arm on the same side as the implant for one week.
  - 3. Check with your doctor about returning to work.
  - 4. When using a cell phone do not dial the phone near the ICD.

### General information:

- 1. Remind your doctors and dentists that you have an ICD.
- 2. Tell airport security you have an ICD.
- 3. Carry your ICD identification card with you.
- 4. Microwaves and other household appliances generally do not affect ICDs.

You received radiation (x-ray) during your pacemaker implant. If you see a reddened area on your back or chest this could have been caused by radiation exposure. Please notify your physician if this occurs.
