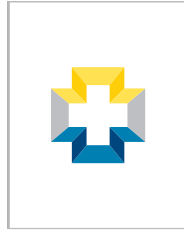

# Criteria for Advanced Heart Failure

<b>I</b>	<b>Inotropes</b>		Previous or ongoing requirement for dobutamine, milrinone, or dopamine
<b>N</b>	<b>NYHA Class/BNP</b>		Persistent NYHA III or IV and /or persistently high BNP or NT-ProBNP
<b>E</b>	<b>End-organ dysfunction</b>		Worsening renal or liver dysfunction in the setting of heart failure
<b>E</b>	<b>Ejection fraction</b>		Very low ejection fraction <35%
<b>D</b>	<b>Defibrillator shock</b>		Recurrent appropriate defibrillator shocks
<b>H</b>	<b>Hospitalizations</b>		1 hospitalization with heart failure in last 6 months or 2 in the last 1 year
<b>E</b>	<b>Edema/ Escalating diuretics</b>		Persistent fluid overload and/or increasing diuretic requirement
<b>L</b>	<b>Low blood pressure</b>		Consistently low blood pressure with systolic <90-100 mmHg
<b>P</b>	<b>Prognostic medication</b>		Inability to up-titrate (or need to decrease/cease) ACE inhibitors, beta-blockers, angiotensin receptor, neprilysin inhibitors or mineralocorticoid receptor antagonist.
