INCEPTTM: Intensive Care Emergency Procedure Training

The proof is in the data. Our INCEPTTM course has been proven to increase participants' knowledge, technical ability, and confidence related to performing vital critical care procedures when indicated. Our ability to establish baseline data levels with each respective category is what allows us to zero in on each participants' needs and make the course truly effective.

Pre- and Post- Course Assessments

Prior to every INCEPTTM course, we administer a baseline assessment that includes knowledge based questions, coupled with a survey to establish Pre-Course Confidence Levels focused on overall knowledge of the procedures and, the technical ability needed to quickly and safely administer care.

At the conclusion of the course, the exam is administered again to evaluate increases in knowledge from the previous exam. Additionally, the confidence levels regarding the procedures and technical factors are also collected. This allows us to generate an overall report outlining increases in confidence, technical ability, and foundational knowledge retention.

Procedural Grading

In addition to the exam and surveys, physician instructors evaluate the participants related to their ability to complete the procedures outlined in the curriculum correctly. Each participant is graded on every procedure as they progress through the modules towards the end of the course. These evaluations are then embedded in the final outcome report provided to each participant so they can identify their strengths and areas to improve moving forward.







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
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How Does the Data Look?



The first component administered is our baseline knowledge exam. Across all of our courses, the pre-course test has resulted in an overall average score of 62%. Following the completion of INCEPTTM, the exam is administered again. The overall, average post-course exam score, rose to 74% following completion of the program.




Our next course outcome centers on the confidence participants have in successfully naming the contraindications, risks, indications, and procedure steps involved in each scenario. On average, participants have felt 49% confident they can successfully name these facts and procedure steps involved without any instruction. Following the completion of the course, these confidence levels have skyrocketed to 85%. A fantastic 36% increase overall.



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Finally, our last outcome evaluated is the technical confidence each participant has at the beginning and end of the INCEPTTM course. Prior to any instruction, participants report they feel confident in performing the technical aspects of the procedures 41% of the time. The INCEPTTM design and curriculum dramatically improves this particular factor. We shift from 41% to 83% for a 42% increase overall.
